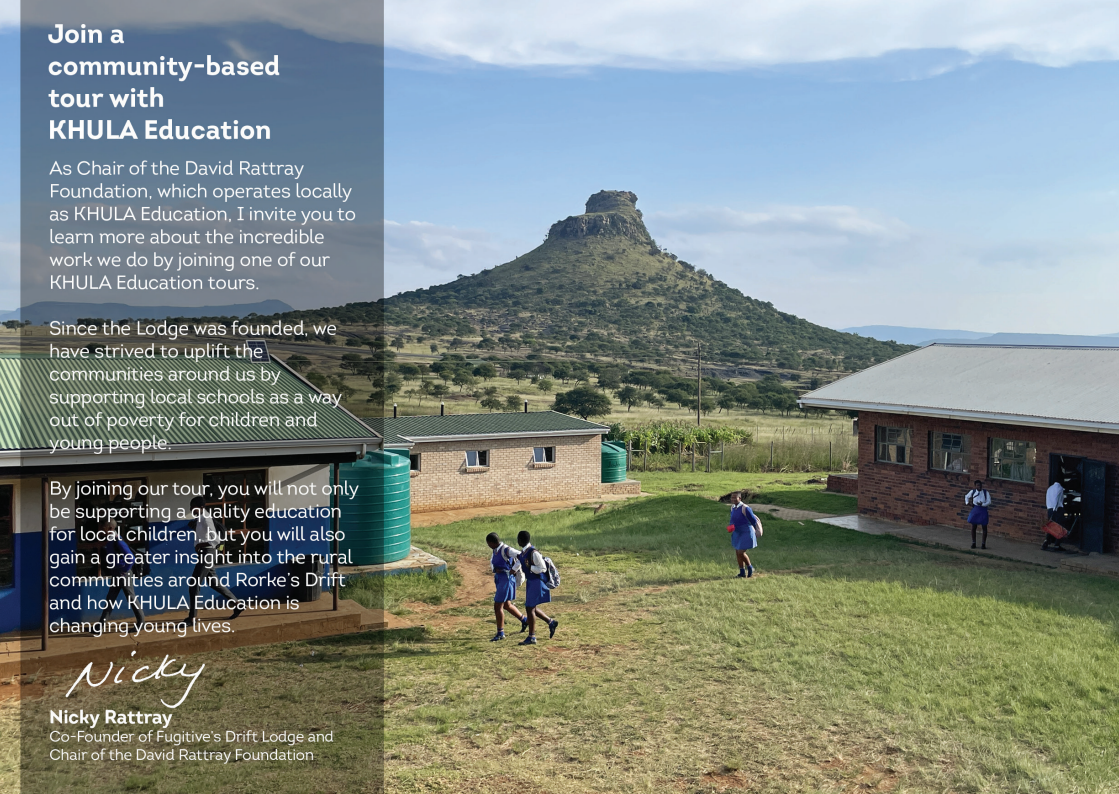
Since the Lodge was founded, we have strived to uplift the communities around us by supporting local schools as a way out of poverty for children and young people.

# About us

South Africa both tops international rankings as the most unequal country in the world and has the highest unemployment rate globally. Amnesty International has decried its education system as “broken, unequal and failing the country’s youth”. These inequalities become all the starker in rural, invariably black communities.

KHULA Education is a small but mighty NGO that is tackling these issues and breaking the chain of intergenerational poverty. We work across the entire academic ecosystem, assisting teachers, principals and critically, over 6,500 children and young people from preschool through to graduation and further education or decent work.

With our support, previously failing schools now compete at the national level, with exam pass rates soaring from 54% to 91% in just a few short years. We have helped hundreds of young people to access further education and gain decent employment in fields including teaching, medicine and IT.

# Tour Details

**When:** Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9am – 11am. It may be possible to arrange a tour on other week days with at least 24 hours' notice.

**Cost:** We ask for a minimum charitable donation of R550 per guest. All proceeds will support KHULA Education's work in the local community.

**Bookings:** Please book at Lodge Reception.

**What's included:** No two tours will be the same as we run different activities throughout the week and vary the schools we visit to minimize any disruption to students, but typically they include:

- Visiting one of our KHULA preschools
- Touring the Charles Aikenhead Skills Hub, where we offer skills and employment support for unemployed young people
- Enjoying the stunning views of the Buffalo River with tea on the Skills Hub deck
- Visiting a local government school and meeting members of KHULA's teaching team
